DataLogix Rapid Response Team braces for post-hurricane rescue work

Our senior team of 3G/UMTS experts who are assigned to the southern states have been placed on high-alert for emergency deployment in south Texas and western Louisiana to repair and rehab cell sites that were damaged by the back-to-back hurricanes Gustav and Ike that recently visited the region. The "Houston, we have a problem" Mission is currently underway in the aftermath of the devastation wrought by Hurricane Ike over the last weekend, forcing the evacuation of almost 2 million people and rendering another 1.5 million who stayed without electricity and clean water.

Although the expected damages to people and property may not be as severe and devastating this time as that wrought by hurricane Katrina exactly three years ago because the authorities are much more prepared now, there may still be a lot of post-hurricane repair and rebuilding to be done to the sites. As of this writing, hurricane Ike had just left the Galveston and Houston area after wrecking havoc and where total damage is now estimated at 58 billion dollars.

Three years ago, Datalogix's "Katrina heroes" Yves T., Yul B., Vergel D., Danny B., Cesar C. and Sonnie J. joined a Rapid Response Team that went to New Orleans and Biloxi, Mississippi soon after the waters from the massive flooding caused by Katrina had receded. They still faced extreme hardships such as: severe shortage of food, water and gasoline and they had to sleep in their SUVs because there were no hotel rooms available for a hundred miles. But they accomplished their mission well and we received grateful congratulatory messages from T-Mobile for a job well done. Datalogix will always be proud of these guys who volunteered to do the work under very difficult conditions.

Here's hoping that our brave guys respond again to the present crisis if called upon, and come out of it safe and sound. We are also praying the situation will not be as bad as Katrina.
